



PINE TREE PERSONAL EQUIPMENT LIST

UNIFORM

- 1 Official Boy Scout Shorts*
 - 1 Official Boy Scout Trousers* – Fall only
 - 1 Official Boy Scout short sleeve shirt
 - 1 Official Boy Scout metal neckerchief slide
 - 1 Official Boy Scout Cap (Olive Green)
 - 1 Official Boy Scout web belt
 - 1 Set of official Boy Scout **olive green** shoulder loops
 - 2 Pair of official Scout socks (solid green, new version Scout crew socks – NO ankle socks)
 - 1 Pair hiking boots or sturdy comfortable shoes (NO canvas tennis shoes, sandals, or open toed shoes)
- Underwear for three days

Jacket

Rain gear

Scout tee shirts. BSA or Troop tee shirts are acceptable. Non-Scout tee shirts shall be plain solid color.

* Official BSA zip-off pants fill the requirement for both shorts and trousers.

****CANDIDATES MUST CHECK IN TO THE COURSE IN FULL FIELD UNIFORM (CLASS “A”)****

PATCHES ON UNIFORM SHIRT * UPDATED 2024 *****

Right sleeve – American Flag required. Troop patrol patch allowed.

Left sleeve – Indian Nations Council shoulder strip required. Troop position patch allowed. Trained patch allowed.

Left sleeve - Pine Tree Troop number 139 (as provided) to be securely pinned / sewn over troop number.

Above left pocket – World Brotherhood Crest (2” above left pocket centered) required. Crest rings and youth knots allowed.

Left pocket: Rank patch is allowed.

Right pocket flap: OA lodge patch allowed.

Right pocket: Unadorned. This area is generally reserved for temporary patches that are not sewn on. Hanging patches shall be removed.

PERSONAL GEAR

>> **Each Scout MUST provide their own tent.** <<

Tent, ground pad, sleeping bag, pillow. Cot is optional. Hammocks are not allowed.

Waterproof ground cloth if required for tent.

Camp chair recommended.

Mess kit including plate, bowl, cup, knife, fork, spoon, canteen, or water bottle.

Toilet articles: towel, washcloth, soap, mirror, comb, toothbrush, toothpaste.

Scout Handbook.

Two ball point pens (minimum).

Small pocketknife capable of cutting ¼” rope. Blades shall be shorter than the width of your palm. No sheath knives.

Matches in waterproof container.

Flashlight or headlamp, extra batteries.

Personal first aid kit.

Cheap wristwatch (smart watches are not allowed).

50 feet of ¼ inch sisal rope (no cotton or nylon).

Compass.

Cold weather items (as necessary for the season) .

Insect repellent (lotion OR stick – NO AEROSOL CANS OF ANY TYPE)

Personal items should be packed for mobility as Scouts will carry their belongings to the campsite. Backpacks are preferred.

No other items will be needed for the course – Do not bring anything that is not listed.

Cell phones, smart watches, electronic games, mp3 players, and other electronics ARE NOT ALLOWED - NO EXCEPTIONS!

In case of emergency, contact Course Director of adult staff as directed at the parent meeting following opening ceremony.

Please check with your Troop for items you can borrow if you do not have them.
